PE and Sports Funding Strategy 2025/26



The PE and Sport Premium is additional government funding aimed at enhancing physical education and sport provision in primary schools. At Boston Endeavour Academy, this funding is used to improve the quality of teaching, broaden participation, and support the physical development and wellbeing of all pupils. Through the strategic allocation of this funding, the school intends to:

- Raise the standard of PE provision by developing staff expertise, enabling high-quality teaching and learning, and ensuring pupils benefit from specialist facilities and coaching not otherwise available.
- Broaden the range of sporting opportunities within the school, ensuring all pupils can access a diverse and engaging curriculum that promotes lifelong participation in physical activity.
- Expand competitive sport opportunities to build pupils' confidence, teamwork, resilience, and enjoyment in representing the school in intra- and inter-school competitions.
- Invest in appropriate resources and equipment to support effective delivery of PE and extended sports provision, ensuring safe, inclusive, and high-quality experiences for all pupils.
- Support pupil health, wellbeing, and physical development, ensuring targeted interventions, such as swimming and physiotherapy, are accessible to those who need them.

By focusing on these areas, Boston Endeavour Academy ensures that Sports Premium funding delivers tangible outcomes in pupils' physical skills, confidence, engagement, and overall wellbeing, in line with national expectations and curriculum objectives.
