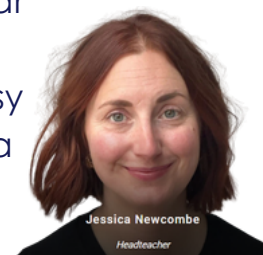


Message from the HeadTeacher
